RCIA MEMBERS ATTEND RITE OF CALLING CANDIDATES TO CONTINUING CONVERSION

Today, March 16th, 2014, Cardinal Dolan will celebrate the Rite of Calling Candidates to Continuing Conversion at the Cathedral of St. Patrick. After the homily at both the 10:30 and 12:00 Noon Masses, the RCIA candidates will be sent to the Cathedral with their sponsors and the RCIA Coordinator Mary V. Widhalm. These candidates who have already been baptized are preparing to complete their Sacraments of Initiation by being confirmed and receiving First Eucharist during the Easter Vigil on April 19th, 2014.

In the ceremony at the cathedral the candidates are presented to Cardinal Dolan. Their sponsors and the community present attest to their desire to participate fully in the sacramental life of the Church.

The Holy Name of Jesus community congratulates our 17 candidates! May they come to a deeper appreciation of their baptism into Christ's death and resurrection. Pray that all of us have hearts open to the promptings of God's Holy Spirit and that our Lenten journey toward the glory of Easter is blessed with the graces of perseverance and generous love.

MAKING ALL THINGS NEW
CLUSTER SUGGESTIONS TO
THE ARCHDIOCESAN ADVISORY GROUP
Part II of III

Our parishes will form a Cross Parish Collaboration Committee, using the four themes of “Making All Things New” to focus our efforts.

(1) Sacramental Life

-
- Increase the joint celebration of Sacraments, specifically focusing on First Holy Communion, Reconciliation, and Confirmation
- Establish a ‘pulpit sharing’ program through which the priests of the parishes will preach across the cluster on themes unique to their own parishes; it is hoped that this will bring the communities closer together
- Establish a monthly reconciliation service that will rotate amongst parishes
- Establish a cluster-wide pilgrimage to a church within the cluster to celebrate World Day of the Sick; the service will work to incorporate the themes of Lourdes, specifically processions, the rosary, anointing, and the waters
- Establish a program to encourage parishioners within the cluster to attend those parishes that have feasts associated with their names (e.g. Corpus Christi, Holy Trinity, Ascension) on Holy Days; these services will be enriched by the sharing of ministers / choirs and increased attendance
- Establish a cluster-wide program to train ministers of the Word and Eucharistic
- Meet regularly to share ideas and identify additional ways for the parishes to enrich the sacramental lives of the parishes to enrich the sacramental lives of the entire cluster

(2) Evangelization, Catechesis, Catholic Schools and Lifelong Religious Education

- Establish cluster-wide programs for Adult Religious Formation, Vocation Awareness, and Youth Ministry
- Establish a cluster-wide focus to increase support for the clusters Catholic Schools
- Create a cluster-wide program to reach out to those not able to fully participate in parish life due to age or handicaps; this includes shut-ins, the hospitalized, and those living in nursing homes residing within the boundaries of the cluster
- Ensure all parishes follow the rules and guidelines published by the Archdiocese regarding catechesis

(3) Stewardship & Outreach

- Engage Archdiocesan resources to educate the cluster on the spirituality of stewardship, its importance to the sustainability of the parishes / cluster, and the means to increase stewardship across the cluster
- Consolidate programs that are active in multiple parishes and would benefit from a broader ‘critical mass’ focus, specifically:

Retreats & pilgrimages

RCIA

Homebound, infirmed care

Children's Faith Formation

Language / cultural-specific

Lifestyle / life stage specific service programs, including Gay Fellowship Explore the feasibility of retaining a cluster-wide, dedicated, salaried, professional to form an effective, efficient operating model without compromising quality or parishioner engagement

- Establish a cluster-wide focus to create programs to concentrate on:

Parent Support

Parent Advocacy

The marginalized, alienated, and ‘unchurched’

- Expand the clusters’ involvement in established Upper West Side Inter-faith groups and functions
- Establish a permanent cluster-wide Advocacy Committee to represent current issues at local and state organizations (issues include livable wages, affordable housing, immigration and the needs of the elderly); establish cluster-wide dialogue with the Manhattan Borough President to increase awareness of the challenges facing the cluster and seek the appointment of a member of the cluster to sit on the local Community Board
